Moving Forward in Hope

Happy New Year! Greetings to all families and friends of SACBC. I look forward to a new year that will bring hope and a renewed sense of meaning in all of our lives. 2021 came and went in a flurry, all while at the same time passing quietly by. I am not sure how that works, but I find myself writing a new greeting message when I feel like I just did this not too long ago, certainly not a year ago!

It is hard to imagine that I came here to SACBC in August 2020, making it about one and a half years. Our move here was in the midst of the pandemic, when there still wasn't a vaccine. We had many worries at that time. After sometime, the vaccine came out and we were relieved of the situation. But it seems like as one thing gets solved, yet another problem arises out of the situation. As I am writing

this article, the Omicron variant is spreading throughout the world. The news I am reading is saying that there will likely be a variant in the future which will be resistant to the vaccine we have right now. So again, as we get one thing solved, a new problem arises. I'm no rocket scientist, but I suspect that if we get that problem figured out, there will yet again, be a new problem that will emerge from the woodwork. It seems that we will never catch a break from this pandemic. We are actually told that we should get used to living with coronavirus, as this disease is here to stay with the human race.

If we look at this issue of the coronavirus from a Buddhist lens, this pandemic is but another example pointing to the larger issue of the human condition: suffering. Let us take the issue of war. Let's say, for the sake of argument, that the United States is able to resolve the rising tension between Russia and Ukraine. Even if war is averted this time around, it will be so temporarily before another situation will arise between the same two countries or elsewhere in the world. The issue of war will come up again and again. The same can be said for most other social issues. Poverty, world hunger, our latent policies towards climate change, geopolitical tensions, the widening gap between the rich and the poor, discrimination against minorities, treatment of immigrants in this country, and so on. It will continue on and on. If we find a solution for a problem, another problem will arise, and the suffering will continue. So long as we humans fail to see the root cause of suffering, which is to look at this self and the human condition, we will always be looking for the answers to our problems in the wrong places.

This is not to say that we should not take part in finding concrete resolutions to these various problems. However, we must remember that the real resolution will never be found outside of ourselves. This is because the root problem is not outside of ourselves—the root problem is in fact, found within the self. What shows us the true human condition is none other than the teaching of Amida Budha's Great Wisdom and Compassion. For this reason, let us move

このコロナの問題を仏教からしてみますと、パンデミックそのものは人間の苦しみを象徴していると 考えることができます。例えば、戦争を考えてみますと、もしアメリカがロシアとウクライナの間の 戦いを防げられたとしても、それはちょっとの間のことで、いつかまた戦争の問題が出てくるでしょ う。戦争そのものは次から次へと起きてきます。様々な社会問題も一緒ではないかと思います。貧困 、食べ物がない状態、環境問題に対する不振な態度、差別など次から次へと続きます。もし、何かに 関して解決があったとしても、直ちに更なる問題が起きてきます。人間は「自我」というものが全て の問題の源だと気づかない限り、本当の解決に達することが不可能です。


