



## Qigong Class Sign-Up: Step by Step – Sign up in person OR online

The Wuji Qigong Fundamentals class is scheduled to start Monday, January 2, 2023, at 8:30 a.m. Details were in the December 2022 Golden Chain. The following are more specific instructions for signing up for the class.

### 1. You may attend the class in-person at Sangha Hall OR on ZOOM.

- a. **In person:** Come to Sangha Hall and sign up for the class with Karen Fujii. You do not need access to a computer to sign up or participate weekly in the class. Please come at least 30 minutes before class to sign up the first time you attend.
- b. **On Zoom:** sign up using the information below. If you need help signing up to attend on Zoom, come to class for help or contact Karen Fujii directly for help.
- c. If you sign up and get the Zoom link, you may attend class in person or on Zoom, as your schedule allows.
- d. You may start the class on any Monday. By signing up with Karen Fujii or online which requires creating an account, the system will keep track of your first day which is free and then how many classes you attend after that. The cost is \$15 per class if you pay for one class at a time. The cost is \$120 if you pay for 10 classes as a “package”. See #2 below for how to pay.

### 2. Paying for the classes: There are two ways to pay:




