I am a link in the Buddha's golden chain of love that stretches around the world. I must keep my link bright and strong. I will try to be kind and gentle to every living thing and protect all who are weaker than myself. I will try to think pure and beautiful thoughts, to say pure and beautiful words, and to do pure and beautiful deeds, knowing that on what I do now depends not only my happiness or unhappiness, but also that of others. May every link in the Buddha's golden chain of love become bright and strong, and may we all attain perfect peace.

"I Reflect Within Myself"

Well, it has happened. My son returned from school one day and told me I should believe in God. He tells me I should believe in God because He has created everything and is all-powerful. My son tells me that a person named Jesus died for everyone's sins. He then goes on to say that those who don't believe in God will be deprived of happiness and be sent to Hell. I later came to find out that my son was scared of learning that because he was a Buddhist, he, too, would be sent to Hell. This terrified him.



This brought back a memory of mine when I was told the same thing in seventh grade by my Korean friend, a devout Christian. He later became class Valedictorian at our high school, so you can see how being told this message from a highly intelligent person can be particularly persuasive. I remember being consoled by my father, who said I should not worry about such things. Nevertheless, the impact remained in my heart into college. How can someone so smart tell others such a vicious message with such conviction? It didn't make sense...unless, maybe...it's true?

Today, I struggle with how to deal with the situation my son is in. Unfortunately, he was told this hateful message at a much earlier age than myself. I cannot begin to imagine how many Buddhist children over the generations were told this, and their parents did not know how to respond. As a result, because it was easier to give in to what others in society were saying, these families converted to the predominant religion. They gave in to their doubt of the Buddha's Primal Vow.

I have many emotions that go through my mind, but at my wife's advice, I refrain from making provocative statements to question my son's "well-intended" classmates. For now, I am forced to recall the expressionless Amida Buddha. In the face of Amida Buddha, you can yell at the Buddha, slander, deface, and disregard the Buddha's message. One can be happy, sad, angry, flustered, stressed, and anxious in the face of Amida. But what is the Buddha's reaction? Expressionless. The Buddha waits. The Buddha remains until we are ready to hear this message. Over time, as we go through the array of steps in our process of doubting the Buddha's wisdom, we are slowly nurtured by his Compassion. The Buddha does not scold, banish, condemn, or punish those who do not believe. The Buddha waits because the Buddha knows it is all a long process. That's the audacity of Amida Buddha's boundless Wisdom and Compassion.

As a parent, when my child feels fear, I empathize with that fear. When my child feels sadness, I feel sadness. When my child feels happiness, I feel the same happiness. Similarly, Amida Buddha feels and understands the

emotions we do. In raising my son, I think I am slowly being nurtured to understand our spiritual parent's wish for all beings. That wish is for all sentient beings to be free from suffering. So, I will tell my son one thing I hope he will take with him throughout his life. I will say to him that in the other person's worldview, some will make it to happiness, and others will be banished to eternal damnation. However, in our worldview, both he and his friends will all someday go to a world where no one suffers.

Shinran Shonin begins his major work, the *Kyogyoshinsho*, with the words, "I reflect within myself." Shinran Shonin is trying to express that he has received the universal message that is so difficult to come to encounter in this world, and yet, he has been able to hear this message now. It is as if he has found a golden egg that most others will never find while in this life. That golden egg is Amida's wish for all beings. He tries to express this message in words for others to be able to encounter as well. That is what I would want my son, and any other families struggling with this issue, to hear as well. Gassho.

ひそかにおもんみれば

ある日、息子が学校から帰って早々、私に神様を信じるべきだと言いました。私は内心、「とうとうこの日が来たか」と思いました。息子は続けて、神様はすべてを創造し、全能であり、イエスが全ての人間の罪のために自らを捧げ死んだ。そして、神様を信じない者は不幸になり、地獄に送られると言うのでした。後に妻から聞いたところ、クリスチャンの同級生に、仏教徒である彼は地獄に送られると言われたそうで、それを怖がっているとのことでした。

私も同じく中学校一年生の時に、熱心なクリスチャンであった韓国人の友人から同じことを聞かされたこともありました。高校を首席で卒業するほど知的な人物からこのようなメッセージを受けることは、私にとってかなりショックでした。家に帰り父親に話すと、そんなことを心配するなと慰められました。しかし、そのことは大学までずっと心に残りました。なぜ、あんなにも賢い人が他人にそんな残酷なことが言えるのか。しかも、堂々と当たり前のように。どんなに考えても納得ができませんでした。

そして今、私は息子の悩みにどう対応してあげたら良いのか分かりません。彼が私よりもずっと若くして傷つけられてしまったことが悔しく思われます。これまでも仏教徒の子供たちの大勢が同じことを言われ、親も困惑してしまったのではないのでしょうか。そして、その問題にどう応えたら良いか分からないために、キリスト教へと改宗していった家族が多くいるのではと思い始めました。残念なことですが、彼らは惑わされ、阿弥陀如来の本願を疑うしかなかったと言わざるを得ないでしょう。

心にさまざまな感情がわき起こりましたが、妻の助言に従い、息子のクラスメートを批判するような挑発的な発言はしないようにしました。そんな中、私の頭には無表情の阿弥陀如来が浮かんできます。阿弥陀如来に対し、罵り、中傷し、侮辱し、無視する人がいるでしょう。または阿弥陀如来を前にして、幸せでも、悲しみでも、怒りでも、戸惑いでも、ストレスでも、不安でもさまざまに感じる人もいるでしょう。しかし、私たちがこのような態度をとったとして阿弥陀様は私たちにどう向き合っておられますか？それは「無表情」です。阿弥陀様は怒ることなく、ただただ私たちを待っておられます。そして少しずつ時間が経つにつれ、阿弥陀如来のお慈悲によって私たちは徐々

にそだてられていきます。阿弥陀様は信じない者を叱責したり、追放したり、非難したり、罰したりしません。阿弥陀様は落ち着いて待っておられます。それが阿弥陀如来の無量の智慧と慈悲のはたらきの不思議さです。

私は親として、子供が恐れを感じる時、その恐れに共感します。子供が悲しみを感じる時、同じ悲しみを感じます。子供が幸せを感じる時、私もまた同じ幸せを感じます。阿弥陀如来も親心としてあらゆる有情を哀れみになると教えられました。育児の中で、その親様の御心が少しでも分かるようになるために私が子育ていただいていると感じます。その御心はどのようなものなのかと言いますと、苦難から抜け出せるようにとの願いです。これを「本願」と言います。私は我が子に次のことを伝えたいと思います。それは他の人の世界観では、幸せになる者と永遠の苦しみに追放される者がいますが、我々浄土真宗の世界観では、私と私の友人が共に生きることのできる、苦しみのない世界が待っているよ、ということです。

親鸞聖人は『顕浄土真実教行証文類』の冒頭に「ひそかにおもんみれば」という言葉を仰せになられます。ここでは、阿弥陀如来のお救いのはたらきと出あうことが非常に有難いことであるが、ついにそのはたらきに出あえたと述べられています。この宝物のような有り難い教えには滅多に出あうことができないのだ。しかし、今ここでやっと出あうことができた。まるで宝物を洞窟の奥に発見したような気づきのようではないでしょうか。その宝物と出あえて心より慶ばれたのです。そして、すべての人々がその同じ宝物と出あえるように、是非この教えを伝えていかねばならないと思われたのです。その宝物はまさに阿弥陀如来の本願のことなのです。これが、親鸞聖人が皆さんに伝えたかったことであり、私も同じく望むことです。合掌
