I am a link in the Buddha's golden chain of love that stretches around the world. I must keep my link bright and strong. I will try to be kind and gentle to every living thing and protect all who are weaker than myself. I will try to think pure and beautiful thoughts, to say pure and beautiful words, and to do pure and beautiful deeds, knowing that on what I do now depends not only my happiness or unhappiness, but also that of others. May every link in the Buddha's golden chain of love become bright and strong, and may we all attain perfect peace.

What is That Dot?

It is 8:30 AM and I just had my cup of coffee. My wife is talking to me about an upcoming birthday party that we will be attending this weekend, when suddenly my cat leaps against the wall for no apparent reason. Wondering what the heck my cat is doing, I try to isolate the source of his attention elimination. I eventually realize that it is the light from the Sun that is reflecting off my wrist-watch thus creating a circular light that moves when my arm does so. My cat chases this with the utmost concern. I also have a laser pointer that motivates him in the same way. He is determined to catch that small red dot that mysteriously disappears from time to time. My wife tells me not to use that,



as it creates a lot of frustration for the cat because there is never any satisfaction of ever catching anything. But my cat does not know that. For all he knows, that ominous red dot has plans to destroy the world and it is his job to capture and eliminate that menace that has trespassed into this house that he owns. I wish I could explain to him that the dots he chases are just reflections of the Sun's glare or from a battery-operated laser pen. But he won't ever know that.



And there's a small tragedy in that story. He won't ever know the source of his frustration, but I will.

That makes me wonder: What if I'm the cat in other ways? How much of this existence do I really know? How much do I think I know, but will never be able to get to the real answer? There is a phrase I came across written by Takamitsu Daisen, a Higashi Hongwanji minister. It reads, "Not ever able to resolve on my own this existence of mine is the human tragedy." Like my cat, I am caught in an existence that continues in its anguish because we do not know how to resolve the issue of suffering. Indeed, it is Buddha that sees the plight of the human condition and tells us of the path to be released from this world of delusion. I am no more able to resolve this issue of human suffering on my own than my cat

who doesn't know how to capture the bright white light or red dot. So long as we do not know the resolution to this problem, we will always be caught in this cycle of suffering.

The resolution to this tragedy is to rely on the Buddha's teaching. It is the working that comes from outside of this self. Truth must come from outside of this self. But the human using the English language to try and explain to the cat where that light comes from is very difficult for the cat to understand. Likewise, the Buddha explains to us the source of human suffering and how to be emancipated from this situation, but it is very difficult for us to understand the Buddha's language. It is, in fact, almost impossible. Yet, we are still embraced by the wisdom and compassion of the Buddha. The Buddha says to us, "Rely

on me, call on my name Amida. There is a path for you to escape this world of suffering." This is the meaning of Namo Amida Butsu and this is the path to spiritual liberation. But for a very long time, this phrase is cryptic, almost impossible to receive and accept. Almost.

My cat and I might be deprived from the truth. But when he cuddles up to mom and feels her warmth, OK with his situation. Likewise, I will continue to say the Name and feel the warmth of the Buddha's compassion. That will be my source of comfort in this turbulent world. Gassho.



午前8:30になり、朝食後のコーヒーを飲み終わったところです。妻が今週末に参加する誕生日会の話を説明して います。すると、うちに飼っている猫マウイちゃんが突然壁に向かって飛び出すのです。何があったんやろうと 思いながら首を傾げます。原因を探していきますと、私自身の体があっちこっち動きますが、左腕が動くとマウ イが一緒に動きます。そこで分かったのですが、外の太陽の光が私が付けている腕時計に反射して壁に白い丸い 光が映ります。それを見て彼が気になって追いかけていたのです。それと同じくレーザーポイントが出す赤色の 点も猫が必死になって追いかけ回ります。妻はそれを使ったら猫にとってすごいストレスになるといいますので 、最近になって控えていたところです。

しかし、マウイにとってそんなことは知らないはずです。彼はあの壁に映っている点は敵のようなもので必ずつ かまえて殺してやらないといけないと思っているかも知れないのです。それは敵じゃなくて、ただの太陽の光だ とか、ポインターの光だよと言ってあげたいのですが、彼はいつまで経っても分からないのです。これは一つの 悲劇でもあるなと感じます。彼にはストレスになる原因がいつまで経っても分からないのです。

このことから自分を振り返って、自分はどうなのかなと思い始めました。自分はこの猫みたいにどれだけ知らな いことがあるんだろうと考えだします。私が知っているという限界はどこまでなんだろうと考えていきます。高 光大船先生という大谷派の僧侶は次のような言葉を書いておられます。「自分で自分の始末をつけ得ないのが人 間の悲しさである」。猫が今いる状況の中のように、本当は私も困難な状況におりながら、そのところから抜け 出す方法が全く分からないのです。その私と違って仏様は衆生の苦しむ現状がよく分かり、その世からの解脱の 方法が分かるのです。一方私は、自分で自分の始末をすることができないのです。それはなぜかというと、自分 そのものが問題だからです。これに気づかない限り苦しみというものが続きます。それが人間の悲劇というもの なのです。

人間の悲劇の解決はやはり人間以外のところからこないといけないのです。それは仏様のはたらきからくるもの なのです。ところが、猫に対していくら光の点がどこから来ているのかを言葉で説明したとしても、その猫はな んのこっちゃと首を傾げます。私たちも同じく仏様がお使いになられる言語は非常に理解しにくいものなのです 。なぜかというとそのような考え方が私たち凡夫にとってまったく考えも及ばないもの、つまり不可思議なもの であるからです。仏様が一生懸命私たちに人間が苦しむ原因とその解決を説いてくださっているのに、それがな かなか頑固な私にとって了解できることではないのです。しかし、それにも関わらず私たちは真実の智慧と慈悲 の世界に抱かれているのです。阿弥陀如来が私たちに、「我にまかせよ。我が名を称えよ、必ず救う」と仰せら れるのです。これが南無阿弥陀仏の意味です。

うちに飼っている猫と私は真実から離れているかも知れません。けれども、彼が飼い主のママに可愛がられて愛 情の温もりの中にいると文句なしに幸福です。彼にとってそれでいいのだと信じているのです。それを見て同じ ように、私も南無阿弥陀の名を称えて、仏様のお慈悲の中にぬくぬくといたいと思います。この困難な世の中に 住んでいるからこそ。合掌


