I am a link in the Buddha's golden chain of love that stretches around the world. I must keep my link bright and strong. I will try to be kind and gentle to every living thing and protect all who are weaker than myself. I will try to think pure and beautiful thoughts, to say pure and beautiful words, and to do pure and beautiful deeds, knowing that on what I do now depends not only my happiness or unhappiness, but also that of others. May every link in the Buddha's golden chain of love become bright and strong, and may we all attain perfect peace.

On the Dharma Name

In our tradition, when someone passes away, that person is given a Dharma Name, or *homyō* in Japanese. In other Buddhist traditions this might be known as *kaimyō*. A Dharma name might commonly be given when someone passes away. However, I would like the reader to know that is not the only way to get a *homyō*. In fact, when one becomes a part of this religious order, that person will receive a *homyō* in a ceremony known as a *kieshiki*, or *kikyōshiki*, a Confirmation Ceremony. This is a sacred time in which one affirms that he/she will follow the Buddhist path, always listening to the Buddha Dharma, and placing Amida Buddha's Great Wisdom and Compassion as the center of one's spiritual foundation.



A Dharma Name will typically have the following reading: Shaku (Person's Name). The person's name will consist of two Chinese characters, or *kanji* in Japanese. In Japanese, that will look like the following: 釋00. For example, my Dharma Name is Shaku Gishin. This is written as 釋巍信. The word 'Shaku' refers to the Shakya clan, the family which the historical Buddha Shakyamuni belonged. This means we have joined the sacred family of the disciples of the Buddha. We can liken this to the family name. Then, the given name would be one's individual name, or 'Gishin' in this case. 'Gishin' means "wondrous faith" or "majestic shinjin," which is referring to the mind of Amida Buddha that is given to the individual. Although I do not tout that I have this faith, it is nevertheless, something that I should aspire to become, or strive to find the meaning of in my life. This is why I believe it is important for a follower to be given a Dharma Name while in this life, although this is certainly not a requirement. The Dharma Name serves as an aspiration; it is a goal in which we strive for in our spiritual journey while in this life.

In many cases, a person's given Japanese name is used in their Dharma Name. For example, the name 'Kaori' written as 香織 in modern Japanese has the meaning "fragrance (of the Dharma)." This can be used in the Dharma Name for 'Myōkō' 妙香 where one of the characters of the Japanese name is used in the Dharma Name.

More can be said about the Dharma Name and as mentioned before, I will be introducing some of the Dharma Names of the members who went to Japan on the recent Joint Celebration service. A final note, if you would like to make an *ihai* or a small memorial tablet for a passed loved one who has gone to the Pure Land, we can place an order for one. An *ihai* has an inscription of a loved one's Dharma Name, and you can place this either in one's home *obutsudan* or in the individual's niche. For more information on this, please contact me. I will place some information regarding how to place an order for one in the Golden Chain.

我々浄土真宗本願寺派では「法名」を頂きます。多宗派では「戒名」という言葉を使いますが、 私たちは「法名」と言います。法名とは、よくお亡くなりになられた方たちに与える名前だと思わ れがちですが、実はそうではないのです。ご門徒の方が生きておられるときに頂くこともできま す。当流では、「^読な^{しま}」または「^読依式」といった

儀式がございますが、これは仏教に新しく入られた方が三宝に帰依して、これから仏法の道を歩ん でいきますということを宣言するものでございます。この時に、頂くのが「法名」です。この名前 を頂いて阿弥陀如来のはたらきを依り所として生きていくことを覚悟させていただくのです。

法名を具体的に説明しますと、釋〇〇とあります。例えば、筆者の法名は釋巍信です。「釋」は、 元々釈迦牟尼の釈迦族というところから来ています。つまり、お釈迦様の弟子の一員になるという ことです。これは現代の名字と考えてもいいかも知れません。そして、私の場合は「巍信」と名付 けられていますが、「巍」は素晴らしい、おごそかの意味です。「信」は信心の意味です。合わせ て素晴らしい信心、この上のない信心のことです。これは、私が持っている信心を指しているので はなく、阿弥陀如来様のお心そのものを指しております。そして、私はその信心を深く求めてい く、またはその願望を持って生きていくことを指しているのです。ですから、今生きているときに 法名を頂くことは非常に大切なものであるかと思います。法名があることによって、私が仏法を求 める中、何を大切にしていったらいいのかという目的があらわれるのです。

なお、現代実際に使われている名前(俗名)が法名に含まれることもあります。例えば、「香織」 という名前から釋妙香という法名を頂くことができます。今年の5月にメンバーの方の何人かが 本山で帰敬式を受けまして、その時に法名を授与されました。その時にもらった法名の意味をこれ から皆さんに説明していこうと思っています。

最後に、お位牌(法名を書いた板のこと)を作ることもできます。詳しくは次のページに添付しま すのでご覧ください。お申し込み希望の方は、ぜひご覧になってください。合掌。

A quick public service announcement from Curtis Mark, M.D.:

I bet many of you are confused about vaccines this year. Here is the scoop.

Covid - new vaccine just approved. Targets the most recent strains. Anyone can get it. Availability likely to be in the next 2-3 weeks.

Influenza - nothing new here. Every fall this is available for all ages.

RSV - new vaccine for a cold germ that has been around for decades. Most deadly in infants. Older adults (over 60) should consider getting it. Becoming widely available.

Interesting tidbit - RSV and influenza are clearly seasonal, and vax should be given in the fall because of the predictable pattern. With Covid, so far there has not been any seasonality. So if it becomes a yearly recommendation, when should you get it? We are not sure!

Most of us old people should get all three. You may not decide to get all three at once, but it is safe to do so. Please check with your doctor.

A side note - Shingles vaccine is a 2-part vaccine available for adults 50 and older.

So, roll up your sleeves and take the jabs!
