I am a link in the Buddha's golden chain of love that stretches around the world. I must keep my link bright and strong. I will try to be kind and gentle to every living thing and protect all who are weaker than myself. I will try to think pure and beautiful thoughts, to say pure and beautiful words, and to do pure and beautiful deeds, knowing that on what I do now depends not only my happiness or unhappiness, but also that of others. May every link in the Buddha's golden chain of love become bright and strong and may we all attain perfect peace.

Structure of each vow before the 48 Vows

Each vow is short and follows the same format just like a sandwich as follows:

"If, when I attain Buddhahood, XXXX, may I not attain perfect Enlightenment."

"If, when I attain Buddhahood" is the one slice of bread; "may I not attain perfect Enlightenment" is the other slice of bread, and the part of "XXXX" shows the contents of Ultimate Dharma. Each vow is made this way. But, why does each vow take this structure?

One pickup one episode that shows why. One day I listened to a speaker from Washington DC who talked about his experience of his son. The story goes like this. His son had a serious skin problem. The son's skin got infected and started melting. It gave the son terrible pain every day. So, the father took him to dermatologists one after another. The doctors, however, commonly said that they did not know the cause of the skin problem. So, there was no hope to cure! The father got frustrated very much, but his son was suffering from the pain every day. Finally, the father made the strong commitment or vow: "If skin doctors can not cure, I will do save my son."

Then, he visited the National Library in Washington DC every day for a few years. Then, he found cure for his son, and tried it. It worked very well and his son was freed from pain and his skin returned to normal.

If I rewrite his experience, I can write as follows:

"If, when I become the true father for my son, I surely save my son from his problem. If I cannot cure him, I am not the true father for my son."

We are so-called **"Bon-Bu** (Common persons)" who possess 84,000 blind passions or problems. Not one, but 84,000 trouble makers! How can we be freed from them? First, each vow shows "cause" of our problems (Wisdom). Then, the perfect cure is shown to us (Compassion). The "cure" applies to 84,000 problems. That's why the cure is called "Ultimate Dharma" or Immeasurable working (Amida in Sanskrit).

The part of "XXXX" symbolizes the cause of our problems and the nature of Supreme Dharma. In other words, each vow teaches what I am. Indeed, and fortunately, we can see the concrete forms of Ultimate Dharma through vows. Now, shall we go into each vow.

私は二つの目を持っているが、この目では自分の顔を見ることはできない。 そこで鏡(かがみ)の前に立つ。すると自分の顔が映り「ああ、ここに飯粒 (めしつぶ)がついている。ここには醤油(しょうゆ)がついている。ああ 、髪(かみ)がボサボサだな」と分(わ)かる。分かっていてそのままの顔 で出かけることはない。それらしき顔にしてから出かける。

ところがである、鏡でみる私の顔は左右(さゆう)反対(はんたい)に写っ ていることに中々気付かない。鏡でみる顔が自分の本当の顔だと思っている が、実は、私は本当の自分の顔を知らないということである。なんとも情け ない話ではないか。

その証拠に、自分の名前を英語で書き、それを持って鏡の前に立ってみると 良くわかる。自分の名前なのに直ぐには読めない。それは左右反対にうつし 出されるからである。

さて、なぜこのようなことを言うのかといえば、法(真実)が私に現れる時 は反対に現れるからである。例えば、法は「私の国(浄土じょうど))には 怒(いか)りも・貪(むさぼ)りも・愚痴(ぐち)もない」とあらわれる。 この法の現れ方は同時に「藤井は怒り・貪り・愚痴の世界に住んでいる。そ れゆえにどうしても私の国に生まれて欲しい」と私に願いをかけ、私を求め ているからである。このような法の現れ方は「私とは何者なのか、私は毎日 何をしているのか」を知らせんがためなのである。

法とは、言い換えれば、光の部分しか語らない。しかし、光は同時に影を結 ぶ。この私の影の暗(くら)さを通して光の世界があることを私に知らせる ためなのである。暗い世界に住むなよ、明るい光の中に住んでくれよ、と私 を求めているのである。我が国(光の世界)に住むには「我が名(なもあみ だぶつ)と称(とな)えなさい。それが我が世界に生まれる正しい道なので ある」と教えていますよ。

Thank you for helping at the various funerals these past few months. The families appreciate the various jellos, salads and desserts. I am rotating the toban groups so that members only have to participate every other time.


STORAGE ROOM CRISIS!
