I am a link in the Buddha's golden chain of love that stretches around the world. I must keep my link bright and strong. I will try to be kind and gentle to every living thing and protect all who are weaker than myself. I will try to think pure and beautiful thoughts, to say pure and beautiful words, and to do pure and beautiful deeds, knowing that on what I do now depends not only my happiness or unhappiness, but also that of others. May every link in the Buddha's golden chain of love become bright and strong, and may we all attain perfect peace.



I hope that everyone is doing well and is in good health!

Self-reflection is present in all kinds of Buddhist practices, regardless of sect. In Shin Buddhism, there is one difference in this self-reflection and how it ties back to our “practice”. We are given our enlightenment by Amida Buddha, so the difference is, we do not self-reflect to then move to training ourselves to “be better”. Instead, we reflect on the fact that we cannot do much to make ourselves “good”. The teachings and the Dharma provide insight for us to come to understand and feel why Amida’s compassion is there for us. Something hopefully pushes us to understand and appreciate this.

In the last several years, our house has had some major issues. It was redone a decade ago, but not very well, it seems. The half-dozen or so issues we’ve had, were not disclosed to us when we bought the home. These things take time and money to fix. I am the stay-at-home person, so this is my “job”: talking with the contractors. Most of the time, once they start working, each situation is worse than estimated, which is deeply frustrating.

Where Buddhism and self-reflection come into play here is that *I* need to make sure I don’t displace or project this anger onto the wrong people. It would be easy enough to take out the anger on the contractors, or their workers. I have done day labor work; it is not easy. I have worked

for people who took advantage of me, who I thought would have

taken care of me, only to find out I was expendable. These feelings arise as I am reminded of this, watching these Latino men work tirelessly to try to keep things on schedule.

I am *not* happy with this current situation, but Buddhism has shown me that I have wrongly lashed out at others before, and today, I *cannot* do it to these guys. Their boss thanks me for letting his crew use our restroom, for bringing them coffee, water, and Gatorade, and for getting their lunch. This is not a “good” Buddhist practice for gaining karmic merit. It *is* a “practice” that the Buddha’s teachings urge me to do, because I recall working jobs like this *and* being used with no care for anything other than profit. So ethically, I can only treat these guys better than I have been treated in the past.

Shin Buddhism doesn’t require us to be “good,” but I believe that, through a transformative process, we do learn to uncover negative feelings. This process forces us to reflect inwards, making sure we are not treating others poorly due to our own unrelated emotions. We are not socialized to do this, and *this* is why we need to come to Temple: to hear the teachings. It is due to our foolish nature that Amida’s Vow is all the more directed towards us.

SACBC has a job opportunity for: Office Manager Position

Description: The Office Manager position at the Southern Alameda County Buddhist Church is a salaried part-time position that reports to the President and the Board.

A) Qualifications: The Office Manager position will require the skills of working with a computer (***MS Office Suite (Word, Excel, Publisher), Zoom, Email, Google Drive - Doc, Sheets, Slides, Forms***) and a copy machine. The position will require working part-time, performing the office duties, producing and distributing the newsletter and funeral programs, scheduling the use of the facility, and overseeing the maintenance and repair of the facility.

B) Working Hours: The position shall be part-time and shall require four hours a day Monday through Thursday. The suggested working hours shall be from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. **Vacation leave:** 2 weeks per year; Paid Holidays- In accordance with the annual paid holiday schedule as set by the Board.

C) Office Duties: Office duties shall consist of performing the following:

- 1) **Documents:** Process church related letters, memos, and documents generated by the Minister and Board of Directors for approval and signature as required and completed in a timely manner. Provide assistance to the President, the Minister, Board of Directors, and affiliated organization representatives in copying and creating flyers, articles, and programs related to SACBC events or activities. All copies shall be electronically transferred, when possible, to the SACBC computer for production and future reference. The master files, such as the Golden Chain newsletter, funeral programs, bazaar duty roster, etc., shall be saved on the church computer and backed up on a regular basis.
- 2) **Communication:** Communicate and pass incoming and outgoing verbal, voice mail, and emails that are directed to, from, or between BCA, SACBC personnel and organization members.
- 3) **Website Support:** Assist in updating the SACBC website and social media pages to promote events and activities.
- 4) **Professionalism** Maintain the position of Office Manager in a professional manner in action, dress, speech, and deeds to all who contact SACBC.

D) Golden Chain Newsletter: Produce a quality monthly newsletter that will be informative to all of the membership. The Office Manager shall in a timely manner for publication and delivery:

- Format all articles for monthly publication.
 - Produce the monthly newsletter from beginning to completion
 - Maintain the mailing list and mail all newsletters to those on the mailing list.
 - Send digital copies each month to the person who maintains the SACBC website.
- 1) The newsletter shall basically consist of articles from the:
 - Minister
 - Officers and board of directors
 - Affiliated organizations
 - Sponsored organizations
 - Listing of monthly Shotsuki Hoyo family names (formal Shotsuki Hoyo letters to be mailed out before the newsletters are mailed), donation list and monthly event calendar.
 - 2) Sort and bunch newsletter by zip code as required by the post office. Fill out the bulk mail application. Transport and deliver the newsletter to the bulk post office.
 - 3) Consult the President and/or appropriate Board member(s) regarding resolution of any publication issues.

BAZAAR MANJU 2025

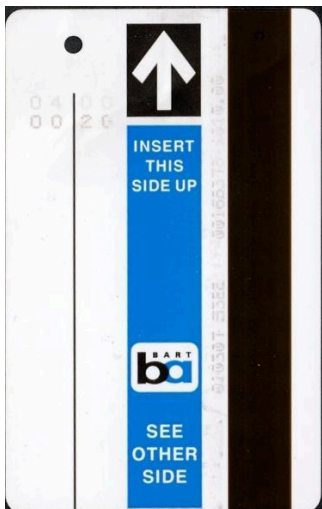
Hi Everyone!

BART Ticket Refund - Fundraiser



As of November 2023, BART no longer accepts Paper Tickets. Riders must have a Clipper Card.

BART will refund amounts that are on paper tickets. I submitted 10 tickets and, after 5 months, received a check! (If there is a "c" on your ticket, it means you paid with a credit card. Those ticket values will be refunded to your credit card.

If you have any paper tickets that might be blue, red, or green, please consider sending or leaving them in the church office. I will submit them for a refund as a fundraiser for our church.

Tickets must have a value of at least \$1 if you submit them personally, **HOWEVER, NON-PROFIT organizations can get a refund for all tickets including those with less than \$1 on them.** So, please consider giving any and all paper BART tickets to the church.
